E. During the last 12 months, the station employment unit engaged in the following recruitment initiatives.

Although job fair opportunities are few and far between in our small community, KMXT participates in all that are offered by the local schools, job service office and through Kodiak College. The GM participates in mock interviews with middle school students who have expressed an interest in broadcast, journalism or engineering programs. There is an annual fisheries convention in the Spring (ComFish) – and KMXT mans a booth there. We distributes information about career and volunteer opportunities at the station with the booth being manned by our reporters, GM, Volunteer Coordinator, board and regular volunteers..

KMXT worked Kodiak Area Native Association to employ a young Alaskan Native high school student as a summer intern. He was trained in digital editing and production, record management and on-air skills. He hosted a music show each week, recorded and produced PSAs, and edited programs. A second intern, through a program at the high school, was trained in record management. During this period, KMXT also had a journalism intern who investigated, reported and broadcast the news for several months during the summer.

KMXT enjoys an active volunteer program. Training for volunteers happens throughout the year, with regular classes occurring approximately quarterly. Individual training is also available. Volunteers are trained in on-air skills, digital editing, and emergency procedures as well as record management.
