RESULTS OF THE 20 DECEMBER 2008 KODIAK CHRISTMAS BIRD COUNT

This was the 36th consecutive Kodiak Christmas Bird Count. A record seventy-seven people participated this year. We tallied 74 species and 13,862 individual birds on count day, and an additional 12 species in count week (the period from three days before, to three days after

count day). The average number of species seen over the previous ten years is 78, so the count day total was respectable, considering the strong winds, snow, and rain that we endured. Despite the bad weather, everyone I talked to had a great time on the count. No wimps in this crowd! This year, hardcore birder Bill Taylor, from Dayton Ohio, came to Kodiak to see Emperor Geese and to participate in the count. As you can imagine, he did get the goose (Life Bird 762), and upon returning to Dayton, he made an entry on his web site describing his trip to Kodiak. Thirteen upland field parties included two Ptarmigan SWAT teams, both of which were successful at finding Rock Ptarmigan. As usual, we had two boats participating: the Ursa Major II and the Celeste. Bird feeder Counts were made from Monashka to Bells Flats at 26 feeders *up a whopping 11 feeders from last year*. Four count day species, Orange-crowned Warbler, Lincoln's Sparrow, Golden-crowned Sparrow, and Gray-crowned Rosy-Finch, were seen only at feeders, while one count week species, Wilson's Warbler, was seen only at a feeder.

There were all-time high counts of six species this year: Emperor Goose (616), Common Raven (1020), Townsend's Warbler (2), Fox Sparrow (80), Goldencrowned Sparrow (18), and Rusty Blackbird (17). One species, Wilson's Warbler, was reported (count week) for the first time ever.

Rare species that have been seen fifteen or fewer times in the 36 years of the count (and the number of times they have now been seen) were: Wilson's Warbler (1), Orange-crowned Warbler (2), Townsend's Warbler (2), Rusty Blackbird (3), European Starling (6), Thayer's Gull (10), Eurasian Wigeon (11), Ring-necked Duck (13), Red-throated Loon (14), and Ruby-crowned Kinglet (15).

While last winter there was a dearth of small passerines, including the "winter finches", this winter they are quite common. Fox Sparrows, in particular, made a good showing, with the 80 birds seen being more than *three times* the previous count high of 24. An interesting question is whether these birds summered on Kodiak and didn't migrate out come fall, or whether they are similarly plumaged birds from the adjacent mainland that migrated down here to spend the winter. Other small passerines that were particularly abundant were, Varied Thrush, Golden-crowned Sparrow, Dark-eyed Junco, Snow Bunting, White-winged Crossbill, and Pine Siskin.

For the first time in many years, Kodiak did not have the highest count day species total in the state. This year, the high count title goes to Ketchikan, which mustered an impressive 75 count day species. Ketchikan compiler Andy Piston launched a count day juggernaut that was so effective, only three additional count week species were found. In the years to come, both Ketchikan and Juneau, under the command of Mark Schwan and Gus van Vliet, will be serious contenders for the state high count title. Well done, Ketchikan!

We are always very thankful to have large vessels covering the marine waters in the count circle. This year the two vessels were the Kodiak National Wildlife Refuge's Ursa Major II, skippered by Jeff Lewis, and Andy Schroeder's Celeste, skippered by Andy. We appreciate their commitment to the count.
